RAIL TO THE COP

In 2021, Youth for Sustainable Travel, mainly focused on the campaign Rail to the COP. The idea was to bring youth activists, policy makers and members of the rail industry together and come up with more ideas for more sustainable travel. Therefore, YfST co-organised a Climate Train, running from Amsterdam to Glasgow for COP26.

1st Quarter

In the first quarter of 2021, the team worked on the basis for the campaign. This included the design of an overall mission for the campaign, the start of fundraising and first applications for funds and a Memorandum of Understanding with our main partner ProRail to set common goals and responsibilities. Additionally, the volunteers set up the different teams which should focus on certain parts of the campaign. The teams were adapted to the changing situations throughout the year. Next to the weekly team meetings, the board of YfST set up a strategy meeting session to plan the bigger picture of the campaign and not focus on small parts. This led to a broader search for possible partnerships. This is an overview of all the partners:

2nd Quarter

In the second quarter, the team focused on concrete tasks and took the campaign to the next level by onboarding new team members, starting to work on the program for the train and fixing the train with ProRail and Eurostar. The team was able to find funding for the campaign and to secure the project with partners. Due to the Ongoing COVID-19

pandemic, the team worked with different scenarios to be able to adapt the campaign to possible cancellations.

The campaign was officially launched on May 1st. This was the start of the communication and mobilisation campaign.

3rd Quarter

In the 3rd quarter, the team established a backbone / interlink group which was responsible for the overall project management and to keep an overview about the different activities. The whole team mainly worked on the application and selection process and defined goals, which people should be on the Climate Train. More volunteers joined the team and started working on the growing amount of tasks. In August, the team started a crowdfunding campaign to support youth activists with their travel expenses and allow more people to join COP26 in Glasgow.

The application website was launched and the first participants were selected. Additionally, the team started to plan the station events in Amsterdam, Rotterdam and Brussels.

The YfST board organised a working weekend in Hamburg with team members coming from Berlin, Amsterdam, Copenhagen and Lund. This meeting kicked off a new working group on participant support focusing on all problems which might come up during the application and booking process and during or after the train ride.

4th Quarter

The Climate Train is scheduled to leave on October 30th. All the working groups finalised their tasks: The program team focused on the onboard program, invited speakers and planned sessions. The program can be found attached. The participant support team was able to refund travel expenses for everyone who asked for reimbursements. Several emails were sent out to all the participants to answer possible questions and inform about the concrete planning.

On October 30th, the train started in Amsterdam and brought 500 people to GLasgow. The whole team worked on communication, press, program, participant support and the station events.

In November and December, the team worked on the last reimbursements.

At COP26 in Glasgow several volunteers of our group had dialogues about racism within the climate movement and in spaces like UNFCCCs COP. We therefore committed, as a collective of volunteers related to YFST, to get educated and educate ourselves on racism and acts of antiracism.

TIME TO EXPLANE

While ExPlane continued its outreach in the Netherlands, the joining of new team members facilitated outreach in other countries such as the UK, Sweden, Denmark and France. Partnerships with other organizations such as Stay Grounded, erasmusbytrain, the FlyingLess network of academics based in the US, zommer zonder vliegen, and Klimatstudenterna were established and intensified. ExPlane members helped organize and participate in several networking events around the topics of flying less in academia,

such as with FlyingLess and Greener Academia. Furthermore, participation at the UniC International Student Summit on Climate hosted online by the University of Laval increased ExPlane's visibility beyond Europe. In the context of its partnership with StayGrounded, ExPlane co-developed material for so-called multiplier trainings on climate justice and aviation to be held in 2022.

| | | Rail has a key role to play in achieving climate goals and should be the backbone of low-carbon transport policies. It plans to drive this growth with government subsidies, widespread airport expansion and incentives for biofuels, while continuing to benefit from unfair tax breaks that encourage unnecessary flights and make climate-friendly travel choices harder. Join us on the Rail to COP to discuss how various organisations and movements (including those working WITHIN the sector) can collaborate to call for fair taxes on flights that discourage frequent flying, take action against aviation industry greenwash, dangerous expansion plans and ensure a fair transition for workers. |

WELCOME TO NS: BLUE AND YELLOW MAKES GREEN

As an alternative to cars and aircraft, trains make a vital contribution to the necessary reduction of carbon emissions. NS is highly aware of its role as a front runner in sustainability.

Our domestic trains have been running on 100% wind energy since 2017, and we have reduced our energy consumption by around a third over the past 15 years. Our partners are working hard to achieve similar sustainability targets.

As a result, an international train journey produces around 80% less carbon emissions than an aircraft to the same destination. This is not where it ends. We want to be a zero-emission business within a decade.



NS aspires to become the most sustainable mobility provider, even compared with electric cars. NS welcomes the European Green Deal and the Fit for 55 package. There is a crucial role for rail in realising the targets set out in these major initiatives.

HS1: THE GREEN GATEWAY TO EUROPE

At HS1 Ltd, our aim is to be the world's leading high-speed rail experience, providing the most sustainable option for transport across the UK and Europe. Independent research commissioned in 2019 revealed that HS1 removes 6,000 cars and lorries from UK roads, and 60,000 short-haul flights every year.



We recently launched a new and ambitious sustainability strategy including a bold pledge to be carbon neutral by 2030.

During our workshop at Investment COP in partnership with the World Climate Summit, we will call for an annual modal shift of an additional 4.9 million passengers (based on air travel patterns in normal times and potential for new routes) to high-speed rail.

This would prevent a potential further 450,000 tonnes of CO2 from entering our atmosphere per year and grow the £66m of environmental benefits already generated each year as a result of people choosing to take the train rather than fly.

ONWARD TRAVEL TO LONDON EUSTON — THE WELLBEING WALK



WELCOME TO AVANTI WEST COAST

Our planet means the world to us, and we're extremely proud to be running your London-Glasgow leg of the Climate Train.

You'll be gliding at speeds of up to 125 mph, tilting round corners on electrified tracks, as our journey takes us past both rural and urban landscapes onboard one of our iconic Pendolino trains.



Our services connect towns, cities and communities via the West Coast Main Line across England, Scotland and Wales.

Avanti West Coast is a joint venture between FirstGroup and Trenitalia, and together we've committed to delivering a cleaner, greener railway which drives train travel forward for the benefit of our planet, our people, our customers and our communities.

We are in the process of submitting our science-based targets for validation and in the next few years we will be replacing our diesel only trains with a combination of electric trains and bi-mode trains. We expect to reduce our absolute carbon emissions from our train operations by 60% by 2030.
